
Safer Internet Day


Here, spring-2025-parents-newsletter you will find information and guidance about family devices, doomscrolling, teen accounts, Roblox and a digital literacy guide.

A Note from the Nursing Team

We are aiming to have a member of the nursing team available at the coffee Parent Coffee mornings.

Please contact the Nurses office directly if there are any medical issues that need to be passed on to the nursing team on 01902 445318. We are on site from 8am so please feel free to call from 8-830 am and then after 9.15 am. Please note that during handover which is 8.30am – 9.15am, when the phone will not be answered.

Just a reminder of how to look after suction machines. Parents/careers are responsible for keeping the equipment clean and for requesting the consumables to support their use.

TOP TIP: Undertaking the care of the suction machine circuits

- 2 packets of suction circuits should be supplied by the community nurses with the suction machine
- Please ensure you have a record of when the circuits are opened as the circuits need to be changed 2
 monthly. Your replacement circuits will be replaced by Community nurses. please contact if they are due to
 be changed and you have had no contact with your designated community nurse. (01902 444700)
- Suction circuits should be Cleaned every 24 hours so rotated between two different circuits is required. Circuits need to be cleaned in a solution made up with 1 part white vinegar 3 parts water
- FILTERS that are based in the lid of the suction pot ARE NOT TO GET WET. If they become wet the suction will stop working. Please contact your community nurse if this happens.
- Pots should be emptied when they are half full to ensure filters do not get wet
- When cleaning circuits please ensure filters are removed from the lids and left in a dry safe place
